## Annotated Bibliography

While finding sources, remember to do the following:

- $\hfill\square$  Examine the source for its credibility, accuracy, and usability
- □ Cite the source in Noodle Tools (databases will allow you to copy and paste the citation or directly download it to Noodle Tools)
- □ Save the source to Google Drive (most sources from databases will give you the option to send it to Google Drive make sure you're signed in to Google!)
- $\hfill\square$  Read and highlight the source for important information

Once sources are finalized, you will be creating an annotated bibliography. An annotated bibliography consists of the citations of the sources you are planning on using in your project as well as short (about 150-200 words) annotations that analyze the accuracy and quality of the source as well as what the source could be used for throughout the project.

To create the annotation, click on the particular source that you are annotating and click on "options." From there, click on "edit."



The following page will pop up. This is where you will be writing your annotations. Once you are finished writing the annotation, **make sure to include your name** so that it is clear who in the group wrote which annotation. <sup>©</sup>

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Each annotation should include the following:

- □ A brief **summary** of the source. What are its main arguments? What is the point of the article? What topics are covered?
- □ The source's **strengths and weaknesses.** Is it useful? How does it compare with other sources in your works cited? Is the information reliable? Is this source biased or objective?
- Why the source is relevant or important to your research. Was this source helpful to you?
  How does it help you shape your argument? How can you use this source in your research project?
  Has it changed how you think about your topic?

Each person should contribute at least 5 sources in the annotated bibliography – at least 2 of those sources should be from a database. © Your annotated bibliography is due at the end of the hour **Tuesday, February 11, 2020.** We will show you how to export and turn in your bibliography as a group on Tuesday.
