## Notecards Checklist

Please make sure that **EACH** notecard has the following information. You are required to have at least 2 notecards per source and at least **12-15 notecards TOTAL**. **Notecards are due at the beginning of the hour, Friday, February 21, 2020.**

### Notecard Format (1 point)

- Title describes what the notecard is about
- Title includes the **name** of the person who wrote the notecard
- Source included

### Direct Quotation (1 point)

- Quotation is important to the project – not just a random quote chosen from the source ☺
- Quotation is about 3-5 sentences in length (some exceptions to this may occur)
- Quotation marks are placed around the **entire** quote

### Paraphrase or Summary (1 point)

- Information correctly paraphrased – no additional information or opinion included
- About 2-3 sentences in length
- NO QUOTATION MARKS**

### Original Thinking (1 point)

- Reasoning explains why this information is important to include in your project
  - Why is this particular fact/piece of information necessary to your research?
- About 2-5 sentences in length

### In-Text Citations (1 point)

- In-text citation included at the end
- In-text citation includes the correct information (look at MLA In-Text Citation Cheat Sheet!)
- In-text citation formatted properly – PERIOD AFTER PARENTHESES
  - “Here is an example quote” (Gratz).
  - “If your quote comes from article, the citation will look different” (“Coronavirus”).
